Saints in Hiding

"When they saw the boldness of Peter and John...they recognized that they had been with Jesus." Acts 4:13 RSV

How do you recognize a Christian? Can you know a person is a Christian by the way he or she looks physically? Can you recognize a Christian by the superiority of her or his mind? Is even one's outward action a sure indication of inner faith? By what sign can a Christian be recognized?

There is a sense in which a Christian is not recognized as such by others. The strongest Christian influence in our world has always been that of the unrecognized—the saints "in hiding." These are the people who need no badge. The mark on them is simply the mark of Christ, the reflection of His Spirit, the presence of His grace in and through them. They are people who have been "with Jesus."

This is the definition of a saint. The New Testament gives that name to ordinary men and women who, with all of their faults and follies, have been united with Christ in faith and have experienced His power in their own lives. We are all "called to be saints." This is a blessing that goes on in the depths of our own hearts. Peter and John were recognized finally by only one thing. It was not their appearance or their intelligence or their prestige. It was that they had been "with Jesus."

Thank You, Lord, for making us saints of Your kingdom. Amen.



Faith Lutheran Church Council Minutes Thursday, April 13, 2023

Members Present: President Ken Czop; Vice President Mike Kaufman; Secretary Erwin (Ob) Spruth; Treasurer Joyce Staples; Ministry of Deacons, Mary Koepp; Ministry Of Property, Francis Calar; Ministry of Evangelism Michelle Searcy; and Pastor Rick Mensing.

After determining that there was a quorum, and Council accepting the Agenda, President Ken opened the meeting at 07:10, with prayer and a reading from Joshua 4:19.

The minutes of the 9 March, 2023 meeting with one spelling correction were approved for filing.

Ministry of Deacons

Palm Sunday palms were lost for a few days as there was no one at the church to receive the UPS order and they would not leave it. The default address for all UPS deliveries was changed to the Pickart residence. Should it be changed to the UPS store on Mesa Ridge Parkway?

After struggling to purchase candles that fit our candle holders, it was determined the supply houses no longer carry the candles we need. Red Norden took the new candles home and made them fit. They were beautiful with their brass tops on the altar for Palm Sunday.

Easter lilies were ordered for \$9.00 each by members of the congregation. Dedications were printed in the Easter bulletin. The lilies cost \$14.99 each at Sam's Club and any difference came from the restricted line item for Special Flowers.

There was moderate attendance at the Easter Breakfast and plenty of food. About 10 children took part in the Egg Hunt. Candy for the plastic eggs was donated by members of the congregation.

Ministry of Property

There is a problem with the garage door opener that needs to be repaired. Francis is looking for someone with those skills to help him. There are various items in the garage that Faith does not need any more and can be disposed of.

Resolved that we authorize Francis to dispose of the surplus church property in the best way possible. Moved by Ken, second by Ob, approved by the Council.

Ministry of Evangelism

Michelle reported that she is looking at ways to use our potlucks as a way to encourage members to invite new people to join us and in that way introduce them to Faith. She will speak with those who organize the potlucks for Friendship Meals. She is also still working with the Dance Team to find a date when they will be able to come to Faith.

Having submitted all Council members emails to the LCMC it seems they have not been getting the information. I will again contact the LCMC office and see what I need to do to get them on the distribution list.


Asked about the annual reports since he had not seen all of them so far. He urged them to be submitted ASAP so that Clark could get them in the report.



INTO ALL THE WORLD

This week I've been going through old files and newsletters and, as only old men can do, living through some of the blessings and joy of being a cross-cultural missionary in Papua New Guinea.

My wife, Lorraine, and I arrived in New Guinea in 1952, spending a bit over a year learning the National Language (Neo-Melanesian) and getting introduced to the culture of the Enga people among whom we were to share the Good News of Jesus, our Savior and Lord. Now there are some people who seem to think that missionaries bring God to the people. Nothing could be further from the truth. God is there working with people who are also His even though they still do not know Jesus. Our job as missionaries is to help them come to know Jesus as well as the truth God has already revealed to them.

Lorraine and I were to work in the Lakaip Valley of what was then called the Western Highlands (now the Enga Province), but it was still "closed" by the Australian Government which had a United Nations assignment to care for New Guinea. So we had to wait until we received permission to go into the Lakaip. Before it was opened to missions, we were given permission to walk through the area and get the lay of the land, but were not allowed to talk of where we might want to establish our station in the Lakaip area.

In February of 1954 we were finally given permission to move to the Lakaip area and settle at a place called Papayuku where we were allowed to have a 99 year lease for 5 acres for our mission station and a further 25 acres for a school, church and other things. We were able to travel 5 miles from Papayuku in any direction to patrol the area. Most of our personal belongings, as well as the things we would need for our work had to be carried down into the Lakaip Valley by Enga carriers. If I remember correctly we need more than 100 to bring everything down to our station.

At Papayuku our first task was to build a rough bush structure so we would have a place to live and to store our goods. We had been able to procure some pit-sawn planks which we could use as our floor. So in this little 20' by 30' structure we had our bed, our stove, all our clothing and spades, axes. and other tools we would need. One of the first things we need to provide was a deep pit for our bush toilet and then a small shelter for a bush shower. We had to have our water carried in buckets from a small spring to supply our needs. I have to smile as I remember how much we expatriates seemed to need in relationship to the Enga people whom, by our standards, had very little. In addition to our bed, we had a small stove in this shelter as well as a tub to keep the water in. A lot of the spade, axes and other trade goods were so that we could hire local people to work with us and so that we could buy local vegetables. We paid workers a spade or an ax head for a month's labor and used files, beads, cloth and other things for smaller purchases. It was a great adventure for us as we began to make friends with the local people and try to share with them God's Word. As much as possible we used what they already knew about God, the high god was called Aiatowa, and they were very much aware of what we call sin and disobedience to how they were supposed to live. For them, what God wanted more than anything else, was that people should live in harmony and care for one another.

It would take us several months just to begin to get things started, but we were where God wanted us to be and eventually people did come to accept Jesus as Savior and Lord. How some of that happened is for another time. Just know that it never was us who made the difference, even though we did relate to our Enga friends with love. It was always the Holy Spirit who used events and opened people's minds and hearts to the wonders of God's love in Jesus.
